Preface

ALTHOUGH touring by automobile is one of the modern methods of eliminating distance and a means of bringing into closer touch one community with that of another, yet its growth has been so rapid, and the progress of automobile construction so great, that it has become necessary, first to have comparatively good roads upon which to travel, and, secondly, reliable information regarding these roads that can be traveled.

The Bexar County Highway League profiting by past experience, was strongly impressed with the necessity of a reliable and complete Road Log Book covering Texas, and finally concluded at the solicitation of automobilists and good roads people generally to undertake the preparation of the present volume.

The aim of this work is to furnish to the touring public authentic and correct logs of all such roads in Texas as may be safely and and quickly travelled by automobiles and vehicles. Whenever it was possible county road maps and city street maps have been incorporated, together with information regarding various cities and towns in Texas that the traveler will come to in following the logs herein.

In presenting this book to the traveling motorist we do so with the apology that "to err is human," and should you not find everything herein regarding the roads in Texas, we trust you will bear with us when we state that such information was not available at this time.

Secretary D. E. Colp of the Bexar County Highway League thru ceaseless work, and with the co-operation of other Good Roads Organizations in Texas, make it possible to get what roads logs are in existence in Texas today, and the results of which work are herewith presented in this book.

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


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As to Speedometer Readings

The logs in this Book were all carefully surveyed by accurate speedometers; therefore when discrepancies in readings occur, re-adjust the reading of your instrumnt to conform with log at next positive identification mark in log you are perusing, thus keeping close check on the route and avoiding big discrepancies.

The reason that differences between the speedometer readings of the logs herein and the speedometer of your car occur, are due to the following simple reasons:

Discrepancies often occur in the readings because the tires on your car do not contain the standard pressure of air; that is they are either over or under inflated.

2nd. Turning corners too wide or too short makes a positive difference in readings. One should keep near the inside of the road in turning corners.

3rd. Diverging from your course at unnecessary distances account of on-coming vehicles. The extra unnecessary distance thus negotiated has a positive tendency to throw your readings off and cause a discrepancy. Observe the "rules of the road," but do not take to a field or fence to give the other fellow leeway.

4th. Discrepancies will also occur, where, after the making of these logs, hills have been cut down and leveled, and hollows filled out. This naturally will reduce mileage, and your speedometer readings will become at variance with those of the log. Frequently re-adjust your instrument with log readings.

5th. Still another cause to make a difference in speedometer readings is the spinning of your wheels on wet or slippery places of the road or street. These unnecessary revolutions run up the mileage



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

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SAN ANTONIO

AN ANTONIO, with a population of 125,000 and the metropolis of Texas, is a tourist city par excellence. This is true because San Antonio is different from any other city in the United States. It has an interest, atmosphere and individuality all its own. The leaven of the Latin population gives a touch of the holiday spirit even to the working days. San Antonio breathes of fiestas and festivals, and its very name is suggestive of a good time.

The picturesque beauty of San Antonio is a joy forever. Its historic buil dings are a never-failing source of interest. The venerable Alamo, the cradle of Texas liberty, that was the scene of one of the most heroic episodes in the world's history, is in itself a shrine that is worth a journey to San Antonio to visit. Outside the city four ancient missions, partly in ruin, recall the glamour and romance of the old Spanish days. A beautiful macadam road lined with big trees leads to them, winding through green fields and along the meandering San Antonio River and making the trip a rare pleasure. The old San Fernando Cathedral, with its ancient pictures and relics, is also eloquent of old San Antonio and the days of the Spanish grandees. Fort Sam Houston, where the Government has spent about \$3,000,000 in building the second largest army post in America, is also worthy of the tourist's visit.

The San Antonio River winds through the heart of the city and is spanned by dozens of bridges and lined with big trees, bringing bits of sylvan beauty into the heart of the city. In addition, parks and plazas are scattered throughout the city. Among these are Alamo Plaza, Travis Park, Main Plaza and Military Plaza. San Pedro Park is a beautiful woodland of about 40 acres, where limpid springs gush from the rocks. Breckenridge Park consists of about 200 acres of native woodland. Here big pecan and liveoak trees overarch winding roadways and trail the banks of the San Antonio River.

In addition, San Antonio has about 185 miles of very good roadways, which wind past meadow and farm to all points of the compass. No city in America has more mileage of automobile roads through a greater variety of scenery.

UERO gets its name from the fact that a generation or so ago many thousands of hides of cattle were shipped from that locality, which was then a great cattle raising vicinity, the name Cuero signifying hide in Spanish. It has since become famous the world over for being the place where the "turkey trot" is pulled off annually. The festivities incident to this function originated in the fancy of the inhabitants who sought through them to make manifest in a unique and picturesque form of apgeantry the importance and prominence of their great poultry industry. Here more turkeys are raised every year than in any other locality in the world. They are most of them slaughtered and shipped all over the United States from there, but many of them are kept in the cold storage plant and shipped out to surrounding and adjacent markets, while quite a large number of these birds are shipped alive to different destinations.

Cuero is on the main line of the Aransas Pass Railway and on the Gulf branch of the Southern Pacific. It is also on the Guadalupe River, which stream furnishes the power for its splendid cotton cloth manufacturing mills, which turn out large supplies of this fabric annually that find ready sale in different markets.

It is also directly on the San Antonio-Houston highway and has good roads connecting it with Victoria and other adjacent

points.

It has a population of more than 10,000 inhabitants, most of them thrifty Germans. This municipality, which is a very pro-gressive one, is a seat of considerable wealth, is progressive and enterprising, always on the alert for securing new manufactur-

enterprising, always on the alert for securing new manufacturing and other industries.

It is the county seat of DeWitt County, one of the richest and best agricultural counties in the Southwestern portion of Texas. Its people are not only earnest advocates of good roads, but give good examples to others to follow. Not long since they turned out on Good Roads Day, and although the weather was inclement, the fifty volunteers, consisting of the principal business men, built more than a mile of excellent and lasting highway, and would have doubled the amount had not rain interfered and stepped their constructive work. AREDO, county seat of Webb County, located on the Rio Grande, that mighty river which is the "Nile of North America," is the geographical and logical gateway to Mexico. With a population of 15,000 it is the second largest city on the International Texas boundary between the United States and

Mexico.

Laredo is 460 feet above sea level and 140 miles west of the Gulf of Mexico, so that the sea breeze reaches here, tempered by distance just enough to temper its keenness and modify the somewhat tropical heat of summer. The average temperature is 7 7degrees F.; no matter how hot the days, the nights are always cool and strength-restoring. There is no malaria nor noxious insects. The balmy air is especially soothing to the nerves, and the day cannot be far distant when this characteristic of the place will attract capital to build sanitariums for nervous diseases. The rainfall is 20 inches per annum. There is no numidity, There is no mud. An hour after a heavy rain the streets are almost dry. Laredo contains all but about 4,000 of the entire population of Webb County. The area of the city is \$856 acres—only some 1,000 acres less than that of New York City.

Among the important institutions may be mentioned the four-company army post, Fort McIntosh, which is regarded as one of the chief stragetic points on the border.

Laredo is the center of the greatest onion growing district in the United States, whence are shipped each year thousands of carloads of this vegetable, while the North is still in the grip of ice and snow.

of ice and snow.

Laredo is also the terminus of the Meridian Highway, which extends, straight as the crow flies, from Winnipeg, Canada.

Like all cities where the Latin races are numerically strong, and pre-eminently so in this case, Laredo is extremely picturesque. The traveler finds here a local color powerfully appealing, and an artist might paint many striking scenes with Laredo models. The types and their costumes, the strange wares sold, strange fruits, liquids and musical Spanish language, the unhuried, respectful manners, the absence of sordid haste, the frequent great beauty of the Mexican women and children, all attract and hold the attention. The broad Rio Grande, historic and beneficent with its rich silt-soil, moves along calmly and steadily, as if it knew its power and disdained to speed like the Northern rivers that seem to have caught the commercial hurry of the people there. hurry of the people there,

ONZALES—This historic city is famous as being the place where the first shot in the war for independence of Texas from Mexico was fired. It was when Santa Anna's brotherin law, General Cos, sent a considerable cavalry force to that city to demand the surrender of a cannon that its inhabitants had, that when the party under a flag of truce came to demand its surrender the brave defenders of Gonzales replied: "Come and try to take it." When the Mexicans made the attempt responsive to this dare, the first shot was fired on them. It was a decisive one. The Mexicans retreated. They returned to San Anonthio and told Cos what had happened and for some time he made no attempt to take this piece of ordnance. When Santa Anna came after it on his way to San Jacinto this cannon was dumped into the river and is supposed to be reposing there yet.

ORT WORTH, which is the county seat of Tarrant County, is one of the very prominent cities of Texas. In point of wealth and population it ranks fourth. It is the greatest railway center in Texas, not even excepting Houston, twelve of the trunk lines traversing Texas radiating from there. VALDE is one of the most interesting, active and progressive little cities in the western portion of Texas. It is on the main line of the Southern Pacific and is one of the termini of the San Antonio, Uvalde & Gulf Railways. It is also on the old United States military highway, which is to be reconstructed and maintained jointly by government and State and county aid. This highway connected San Antonio with all of the old military posts as far back as their establishment during the Mexican war of 1846-1848, and old Fort Inge, one of the most interesting and historic of these posts, is located at Uvalde. Uvalde.

It is a great point for the exportation of honey, which is shipped from Uvalde, not by the car load but by train loads. Apiaries are abundant all around there, and they produce prodigious harvests of honey of superior quality and flavor.
